The Need for Adult Literacy Services is Great.

In an increasingly complex and technological society, where first graders work on computers and you can talk online to people anywhere in the world, it is hard to believe that there are adults who cannot read this sentence. A study conducted by the National Institute for Literacy (NIFL) indicated that 17% of the population in Jefferson County and 14% of the population in Lewis County have literacy skills at the lowest level. That means that these adults cannot fill out a job application, read the newspaper or help their older children with homework.

OUR SERVICES

Literacy of Northern New York is a not-for-profit 501 (C) (3) organization that trains volunteers to work one-to-one with adults who need help with reading, writing, math and English language skills. Our one-to-one tutoring service is individualized and confidential. LNNY's student-oriented program focuses on meeting the long-term and short-term goals of our clients.

Our staff assess the reading, math or English speaking skills of our students. We periodically retest students to determine if they are making educational gain and to revisit goal setting.

TRAINING VOLUNTEERS

We offer both online and in-house tutor training.

Volunteers participate in a 12-hour training course during which they learn techniques to teach either basic reading, math or English conversation. During the in-house course, participants receive a textbook, practice professionally-developed methods of teaching, and enjoy interacting with their classmates.

Tutors who take the online training attend a short orientation and complete reading and/or English language learner modules online. After completing the modules, they attend a final in-person session with a staff member.

Those who successfully complete tutor training are matched with an adult who needs to improve literacy skills. Tutors and students meet in public places such as our office or at local libraries. Our staff assesses all the students and recommends books for the tutors to use. The teaching materials are provided free of charge. Helping others become more literate is a rewarding experience.
